








DISASTER & CRISES MANAGEMENT OVERVIEW

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Recent increasing occurrence of disasters worldwide have happened at a large human cost and brought along severe socia-economic consequences for affected populations From the original focus on natural bazards, the disaster theories have now expanded to include a broad range of human-induced disasters, like complex emergencies and crises, thus fitting the disaster and crisis management as an integral part of the humanitarian response. 


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
